Dame Elizabeth Corley's career reflects a rare integration of financial excellence with ethical responsibility and long-term societal impact. Each year, a small number of distinguished leaders are selected for this recognition, forming the 2026 cohort of award recipients.

In her leadership roles across global finance, Dame Elizabeth Corley has exemplified a form of leadership that integrates financial excellence with ethical responsibility and long-term societal impact. As Chair of Schroders and former Global Chief Executive of Allianz Global Investors, she has played a pivotal role in shaping modern approaches to responsible investment, stewardship, and sustainable finance.

At a time when capital markets are increasingly called upon to address complex social challenges, Dame Elizabeth has consistently advanced the view that investment can and should serve broader human purposes. Her leadership in the development of impact investing, including her role in chairing the UK Government's advisory work on social impact investment and



her foundational leadership of the Impact Investing Institute, has helped bring greater rigor, scale, and credibility to the alignment of capital with social good.

Equally significant is her contribution to fostering inclusive and values-respecting organisational cultures. During her tenure, Schroders has been recognised as a leading faith-friendly workplace in the United Kingdom, reflecting a commitment to ensuring that individuals of all faiths and beliefs, and none, can contribute fully and authentically within the workplace. This recognition speaks not only to policy, but to a broader culture of respect, dignity, and inclusion.
